TYPES OF WASTE

RECYCLABLES

These items are materials that can be reused or transformed into new product instead of being thrown away. Common recyclables are: paper, cardboard, aluminum drink cans and tin cans, plastics, and glass.

SOLID WASTE

Solid waste is the unwanted products or useless solid materials generated that is then discarded. Solid waste is most commonly placed in landfills.

ELECTRONIC WASTE

Electronic devices are made with a wide variety of materials. Some of these materials can impose a risk on human health like lead, mercury, and cadmium if disposed of improperly.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Household hazardous waste can be defined as products that can catch on fire, combust, react, and that are corrosive or toxic. Common examples household hazardous waste are: Aerosol sprays, batteries, cleaners and disinfectants, light bulbs, pesticides, pool chemicals,



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

DO:

- Always read the label before buying a product to be sure it will meet your needs
- Use the product for its intended use
- Buy potentially less hazardous alternative to your desired product

DON'T:

- Dispose of materials into the storm water or septic systems
- Burn or bury leftover materials or containers
- Mix materials together



The Soboba Air Quality Website is now up and available to everyone! Go to **Sobobaair.com** to check out the four air quality monitors and their statistics.

The website is an excellent way to learn more about what air quality is and the common pollutants found in the air. It also displays graphical analysis of the four different pollutants monitored: ozone, nitrogen dioxide, PM 2.5, and PM 10. Sobobaair.com is a great resource for people with asthma to check as the data is consistently updating to show the current air quality throughout Soboba. There is a statistics page on the website as well that allows you to look at specific air quality monitors on the reservation and its pollutant data for up to the past 30 days.


